The northern border region of Vietnam has become an insider tip for cycling enthusiasts due to the greatly improved quality of its roads. Breathtaking pass roads lead past mountain ranges up to 3,000 m high and through large, lush rainforests.





We meet in a small wonderful hotel in Hanoi, the oldest of the still existing capitals of Southeast Asia with its old town in the French colonial flair. We will have the opportunity to discover many facets of this vibrant metropolis on a fun vintage jeep tour.

The next day we take the van north to the starting point of our tour near Lao Cai on the border with China. In eight fascinating stages on winding paths back to Hanoi we experience the beauty of the region in all its diversity. Although some of the climbs to be mastered are many kilometers long, they can be described as moderate due to their incline and uniformity. It is a sporty, demanding tour for lovers of exceptionally beautiful mountain passes.

Following the philosophy of Siam Bike Tours, we always choose the best possible, locally available accommodation on the stages. While it is mostly luxurious and cozy hotels or resorts, in more remote locations it will occasionally be simpler hotels or guest houses. Vietnamese cuisine is widely known to be very tasty and wholesome. In larger towns, French and colonial dishes are also available as options. 1st Stage: Hanoi to Sapa Lodge | 35 km | 1,300 m ascent

Our adventure in the northwest mountains begins with a transfer from your hotel in Hanoi to just shy of the border town of Lao Cai. Here it's out of the bus and onto the bikes for the 35km climb up to your lodge accommodation. We'll arrive in time to enjoy the area, farmed by the Hmong, Dao and other minorities for centuries.

Day 4

2nd Stage: Sapa - Than Uyen | 96 km | 1.400 m ascent

From Topas Ecolodge we will have a short transfer to Sapa Town. Our today's ride starts with a mostly gentle climb out of Sapa town to the top of the famed O Quy Ho Pass. Then it's a screaming 20km descent and a gently undulating ride to Than Uyen, where we find our lodgings for the night at the District Guesthouse. This humble institution is usually only frequented by traveling cadres, and will give you a taste of what it was like in the good old days of Central Planning and ration cards. There is a simple yet nice restaurant next to the Guesthouse where we will get to taste the great variety of simple Vietnamese specialties for dinner. Perhaps we might also check out the local market.

Day 5

3rd Stage: Than Uyen - Le Champ Tule Resort | 88 km | 1.900 m ascent

Today's ride mainly consists of a long gradual climb. We will ride through a beautiful gorge and past tiny Thai minority villages until we hit the Khau Pha Pass. Once on top we'll enjoy the great view down to the valley below, where we will then be heading in a 20 km descent to our next destination, the luxurious Le Champ Tule Resort, that even features Hot Springs and a Spa.

4th Stage: Le Champ Tule Resort - Nghia Lo | 47 km | 730 m ascent

A short yet again pleasant day awaits us. The slower speeds in the initial soft climbs help us enjoy even more the beautiful landscapes. The second part is mostly a downhill and effortless route to Nghia Lo. This town is a stopping point for Hanoites on the road and features a few creature comforts. We'll seek out some honest frontier food and the awesome Bigken minikegs that seem to be all the rage in this friendly town.

Day 7

5th Stage: Nghia Lo - Mộc Châu | 126 km | 1.750 m ascent

The Queen's stage. Today's route takes us on an undulating back country road through a series of very pretty villages and over a small, but challenging pass. We will then cross a lake on a ferry and do another shorter 6 km climb averaging 5% out of the Do River valley. From here we jump in the van like the real pros and let the driver take us to our destination.

If you still feel like it, you can tackle the last climb to Mộc Châu and cover another 700 meters in altitude over 20 km. The town of Mộc Châu is home to an ethnic minority group of Thai migrants.

Day 8

6th Stage: Mộc Châu - Mai Chau | 63 km | 780 m ascent

After yesterday's challenging ride, we'll enjoy a shorter and less demanding stage to Mai Chau today.

There we'll be rewarded for our efforts with a stay in luxury at a lodge complete with a pool. We will arrive early enough to both enjoy a short excursion to the nearby village along some picturesque rice fields to find some coffee and cake there and make the most of our hotel's facilities including pool and massage.

7th Stage: Mai Chau to Hanoi + Transfer | 100 km | 1.200 m ascent


